## VOLUNTEER FOCUS – CAROL MOREN

Volunteers are the heart of our organization. This is our opportunity to introduce you to one of our longest serving volunteers; Carol Moren.

Carol was originally from Iowa, she had one brother and lost a sister before she was born. Carol has three children; two daughters, one a nurse in Sierra Vista, AZ, the other daughter retired from public service in Chino Valley. Her son works on computers and lives in Ft. Huachuca, Arizona. She has nine grand-children.

Carol was part of the group involved with founding Dysart Community Center over fifty years ago, she remembers that it was called Dysart Center, but it became confused with the Dysart School District so the name was changed to Dysart Community Center for clarity.



Carol lived across the street from the center, and recalls bringing donuts over to the bricklayers when they were constructing the center.

Carol recalls Dysart being an active 4-H site. She served as a leathercraft instructor and craft teacher, she completed state reports for the English as a Second Language instruction. Carol dispensed used clothing and was always willing to put her hand to anything that would help the center run. She currently serves as Secretary to the Board.

Carol says, *“I think everything we offer is very important. From making anyone who comes in feel that they are special, as well as all the classes and support we give the community, we make them all feel so welcome.”*

Susie Ratley, our Adult Education Director has sixty-three students registered for our English as a Second Language program, being taught by over 46 volunteer instructors.




There is such a buzz of activity in all the classroom areas, that we had to open the kitchen for classes as well.
